CIL SPENDING REVIEW – November 2024 for the year ending 31st March 2025

Neighbourhood CIL is governed by the CIL Regulations and the rate at which it is paid is set out in national legislation. For those Parish Councils with a made Neighbourhood Plan it is 25% (with no CAP) and for Parishes where is no made Neighbourhood Plan it is 15% subject to a cap which is set out nationally (in legislation).

The cap is worked out at £100 index linked per occupied property within the parish. The cap rate is set for the year and changes on the 1st January each year. Thurston's NDP was adopted on the 24th October 2019. Any planning permission granted before that date will attract the 15% capped figure, anything granted after that date will attract the 25% uncapped figure.
