Final Recommendations on the new electoral arrangements



Who we are

- The Local Government Boundary Commission for England is an independent body set up by Parliament.
- We are not part of government or any political party.
- We are accountable to Parliament through a committee of MPs chaired by the Speaker of the House of Commons.
- Our main role is to carry out electoral reviews of local authorities throughout England.

Electoral review

An electoral review examines and proposes new electoral arrangements for a local authority, including:

- The total number of councillors representing the council's voters ('council size').
- The names, number and boundaries of wards or electoral divisions.
- The number of councillors for each ward or division.

Why Suffolk?

- Suffolk County Council currently has high levels of electoral inequality: some councillors represent many more - or many fewer - voters than others.
- Therefore the value of your vote, in Suffolk County Council elections, varies depending on where you live in Suffolk.
- We are seeking to improve levels of electoral equality for local voters

Our proposals

- Suffolk County Council currently has 75 councillors. Based on the evidence we received, we recommend that 70 councillors should serve the council in the future.
- We believe our final recommendations meet our statutory criteria to:
 - 1. Deliver electoral equality for voters
 - 2. Reflect community interests and identities
 - 3. Promote effective and convenient local government

Summary of our recommendations

We have considered all the submissions we received during our consultation on our draft recommendations and further draft recommendations.

The final recommendations propose that Suffolk County Council should have 70 councillors, five fewer than there are now.

The County should have 68 single-councillor divisions and one two-councillor division of Beccles & Kessingland. The boundaries of all but one division should change.


