Reduction in height by approx. 5-6m back to previous pruning points. Prune all side lateral on North, East and West profiles of the tree back to previous pruning points. Prune all side lateral on South profile of the tree back by approx. 3-4m. Thin canopy by approx. 10-15%. Crown lift to appx 6-7m from ground level.
