THURSTON PARISH COUNCIL

MINUTES of the MEETING held on Wednesday 20th October 2021 commencing at 8.00pmin Thurston Community Library, Norton Road, Thurston.

Present: Cllrs. Dashper (Chair), Cllrs. Cornell, Haley, Morris, Rainbow, and West. Also in attendance: Mrs Waples, Parish Clerk and Mrs King, Deputy Clerk.

1. OPENING – the Chairman opened the meeting advising all that the Protocol adopted by the Parish Council for reporting at Parish Council Meetings, would be enacted for this meeting. A copy of the Protocol is available from the Clerk or can be downloaded from the website: https://thurstonparishcouncil.uk/parishcouncil/policies-procedures-and-strategy/.

2. APOLOGIES -

- a) Apologies for absence were received from Cllr. Hay due to personal commitments.
- b) The meeting agreed to accept the apologies submitted, aif.

3. DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY AND NON-PECUNIARY INTEREST FROM COUNCILLORS INCLUDING GIFTS OF HOSPITALITY EXCEEDING £25 –

- a) To receive declarations of pecuniary, local non-pecuniary interest(s) and personal interests in items on the agenda and their nature including gifts of hospitality exceeding £25 there were no such declarations received. Council noted that Cllr. Hay had previously declared a pecuniary interest in Agenda Items 6 and 8.
- b) To receive declarations of lobbying for planning matters on the agenda there were none declared.
- c) To receive requests for dispensations none had been received prior to the meeting.
- 4. PUBLIC FORUM to receive issues from members of the public present on the agenda items as listed: there were no members of the public present.

5. STATUTORY BUSINESS –

- a) Terms of Reference due to the low numbers of serving Parish Councillors to review and approve amendments to the following terms of reference:
 - Recreational Facilities Committee to agree membership to be reduced to four Councillors, quorum to be three all agreed to the amendments as proposed, aif.
 - Planning Committee to agree membership to be reduced to five Councillors, quorum to be four all agreed to the amendments as proposed, aif.
 - Climate Awareness and Environment Committee to agree membership to be reduced to four Councillors, quorum to be three all agreed to the amendments as proposed, aif.
 - Emergency Plan Committee to agree to stand the committee down and have all matters relating to
 emergency planning brought back in-house all agreed to step the committee down and bring the
 matters direct to the parish council, aif
- b) To consider and formulate a response to the proposed Zebra Crossings and Traffic Calming being proposed for Norton Road statutory consultation runs until 29th October 2021 it was agreed that the PC would comment that it accepts the proposals in principal but would like the situation monitored to allow a review of the effectiveness of the proposals. It was noted that following discussion over perceived speed issues along Norton Road, the SNT would be investigating whether there were suitable locations along this route to carry out speed checks. Road.

6. LAND SUITABLE FOR RECREATIONAL SPACE:

a) To receive and consider the background papers to the work previously carried out by the Parish Council as part of the feasibility studies for land suitable for recreational space and to determine their validity – agreement was forthcoming to review the sites and update each with a new level of understanding of each parcel of land. It was agreed to remove Site 2(Land to the North of Norton Road) from the sites assessed as this now contained the new Primary School and Pre-School Facilities. Site 1 (Land to the West of Ixworth Road) was also removed from the review process as it was not currently accessible along with Site 10 (Allotment Gardens – Barrells Road) as the Parish Council wished to retain the allotments in their current status. Agreement was forthcoming for the remainder of the sites to be reviewed in terms of knowledge and understanding of the growth of the parish:

Cllr. Dashper - old Primary School Land - Site 6;

Recreational Facilities Cttee – Sites 4 (Heath Road Play Area); 5 (heath Road land belonging to the Thurston Relief In need Charity); 7 (Thurston Recreation Ground) and 8 (New Green Open Space).

Agreement was forthcoming that for sites 3 (land to the South of Beyton Road) and 11 (land to the East of Ixworth Road) nothing further could be added to this as at this stage both were linked.

Cllr. Cornell - Plum Pudding Field, Beyton Road - Site 9.

All noted the primary objective was to carry out a revised assessment and compare it with the previous assessment and bring back to Council's next Committee Meeting amendments where necessary.

8. To resolve that under the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960, the public be excluded from the meeting due to the confidential nature of the business to be discussed

- a) To receive an update from the Clerk on land that is to form the basis of a feasibility study by the joint steering group set up to evaluate areas to be considered as suitable for recreational space in Thurston it was noted that whilst the focus of the meeting held with Jo Churchill, MP was on the skatepark, the representatives from the PC gave a balance viewpoint that complimentary facilities were also needed. There was very strong agreement that the PC could not do take this matter forward on its own and that BMSDC needed to assist with this matter. It was noted that Cllr. Richardson was in the process of setting up a following meeting.
- b) To receive and consider further parcels of land that might be forthcoming as potential sites for recreational space it was agreed that the parish council was not really any further forward and that the sites being proposed were not unknown to the Parish Council. It was agreed that it would be positive to access something as ownership before the settlement boundary was pushed out further. It was also agreed that above all such a site needed to be accessible.
